## Qubica AMF Michigan Family Tournament

1. The youth bowlers and adult bowlers in this tournament must be USBC certified members. Bowlers will bowl 3 regular games of bowling at the local and state qualifying.
2. **ELIGIBILITY – YOUTH BOWLERS**  
*PARENT/YOUTH DIVISION* – USBC Youth Division members who are 12 years of age or under as of August 1, 2011.  
*PARENT/TEEN DIVISION* – USBC Youth Division members who are 13 through 18 years of age as of August 1, 2011.  
**Adult (non-parent)/Youth and Adult (non-parent)/Teen will compete for Scholarship Points in each division at the state level. Only Parent/Youth and Parent Teen can advance to National Finals.**  
**ELIGIBILITY – ADULT BOWLERS**
  - (A) Only parents, step-parents, grandparents, step-grandparents, great grandparents, step-great grandparents or court- appointed legal guardians qualify for the Parent/Youth and Parent/Teen Division..
  - (B) Any bowler competing as an adult who has competed three (3) times in the national finals of any BPAA tournament (excluding U.S. Open) is not eligible for this tournament.
  - (C) The same Parent/Youth or Parent/Teen team may not return to the national finals more than twice. They may compete through the state finals with the understanding that they cannot advance to the national finals. A  
**DOUBLES TEAM ENTERED IN THE PARENT/YOUTH OR PARENT TEEN DIVISIONS IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR THE ADULT/YOUTH OR ADULT/TEEN TOURNAMENT.**
3. **FORMAT** – Center qualifying is held through May 5 2012, **in BPAA-member centers only.** Bowlers may compete more than once with the same partner at the CENTER level only. Youth bowlers may try to qualify with multiple Parents (Rule 2A). However, youth cannot qualify more than twice for the State level with multiple partners. Bowlers may compete only ONCE with the same partner at the State Level. Multiple participation will depend on the limitations of tournament management to schedule squads. One of every 10 local teams will advance to the State Finals.
4. **HANDICAP** – 100% of the difference between the bowlers combined averages and 440.
5. **AVERAGES – YOUTH BOWLERS** – Current average with a minimum of 15 games, or 2010/11 season-ending average whichever is higher. Current average must have been established in certified league play (in one league), and must include travel league averages. Current averages must be a minimum of 15 games for bowlers in the Teen Division, and a minimum of 9 games for bowlers in the Youth Division. If the youth bowler has neither of the above averages, he or she must bowl scratch (220). Averages set on modified lane conditions (bumpers, shortened lanes, etc.) are not eligible. No sport lane condition averages.
6. **AVERAGES – ADULT BOWLERS** – *HIGHEST* USBC certified average from (1) the 2010/11 season of 21 or more games or (2) the 2009/10 season of 21 or more games or (3) the current certified average of 21 or more games. If the adult bowler has none of the above averages, he or she must bowl scratch (220). *Adult entrants who have ever been re-rated, refused a re-rate, or been disqualified in a tournament must report this at every level of the tournament for possible re-rate. All sport condition averages will be converted based on U.S.B.C. conversion criteria.*
7. **SUBSTITUTE BOWLERS** – Substitutes are not permitted at any level of this tournament. If for any reason an entrant is not able to advance to any subsequent level of competition with his/her partner, then his/her team spot will be forfeited and the team next in place will be eligible.
8. All matters not covered by these House & Zone Rules will be handled by the Michigan BPA Tournament Committee, and all decisions of same will be final.
9. To qualify for redemption of a scholarship earned in this event, the participant must understand that he or she must maintain a 2.0 GPA at the time of graduation from High School. The participant must understand that the scholarship can only be used by enrolling in an accredited college/university/trade school. The Scholarship has no cash value and must be used for items related to tuition, books, or other required financial needs of the specific college/university/trade school. The BCAM Youth Committee will require proof of GPA before scholarship is granted. Also, additional information related to some form of Community Service or Activity is required to qualify for the Scholarship.
10. Upon graduation, participants may apply to the Michigan Scholarship Pool.

**AVERAGES AT STATE FINALS** – The adult bowler and the youth bowler must use the USBC certified in-house entering average, unless the USBC certified league average through March 31, 2012, of 21 or more games is higher, then that average must be used. **The state finals average must be a USBC certified league average for at least 21 games.** If the adult or youth bowler has neither average, the bowler must bowl scratch (220). *If the average through March 31, 2012, for any bowler is lower than the in-house entering average for 21 games or more, then the in-house entering average will be used at the State Finals.*

*If a Bowling Center does not have enough entries or does not run a qualifying event, a team from a BPAA Center may enter the State Finals directly. If a team direct enters, the entry fee to the state finals is \$40.00 per team.*

**THE WINNING TEAM FROM EACH OF THE TWO DIVISIONS WILL RECEIVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO COMPETE IN THE BPAA INTERNATIONAL FAMILY TOURNAMENT TO BE HELD JULY 26-29 IN JUPITER, FLORIDA .**
